

President's Page



Stock Course Description:

The five-day Leave No Trace Master Educator Course is designed for individuals who will be teaching Leave No Trace Trainer Courses and Leave No Trace Awareness

Workshops. The course focuses on the specifics of running Trainer Courses, i.e. a significant portion of the course is spent covering how to facilitate a Trainer Course – planning, logistics, equipment, running groups in the field, meals, risk management, how to teach, etc. Through classroom discussions, lectures and a four-day outing, this course covers the seven Leave No Trace Principles and outdoor ethics, as well as gives the participants tools and techniques for disseminating low-impact skills to outdoor enthusiasts.

The BCHC Master Educator Stock will be a base camp-style courses that generally involve minimal travel (hiking, etc.) during the day.

Summary of the Joint Chainsaw Training

Plumas National Forest, Feather River District and BCHC

On the weekend of March 25th & 26th, 2017 a Chainsaw Training to certify individuals to operate chainsaws as a "B" Bucker was undertaken by a Partnership between Plumas National Forest, Feather River District and the Backcountry Horsemen of California Chainsaw Training Program.

BCHC Chainsaw Trainer and event organizer Bob Gage, BCHC Sutter Buttes Unit President made the initial contact with Plumas National Forest employee, Jackie Pope. Jackie was willing to work with BCHC and the plans for a joint Partnership Chainsaw Class began. As President of the Sutter Buttes Unit of BCHC, Bob already had a good working relationship with Plumas National Forest, Feather River District Personnel and District Ranger, Randy Gould. PNF Saw Trainer, Mike Hyett also met with Bob, & Jackie to work out the details of the Class and they also made a field trip to find a suitable location for the in-field demonstration and evaluation of each Chainsaw Training candidate.

The procedure for student application for the class was begun on the BCHC side. The class was also opened to several volunteer groups and two selected individuals were included in the total number of students in the class. These individuals were from OHV 4X4 groups that also volunteer in the PNF on OHV trails. (The PNF Chainsaw Trainers were responsible for all the paperwork and evaluation of these two students/individuals.) All BCHC Chainsaw candidates/students were required to have 1st Aid/CPR & Blood Borne Pathogen training prior to taking the Chainsaw Training Class. (documented).

Day One:

The Chainsaw Class began on Saturday 3/25/2017 at 08:30 with coffee, pastries, introductions of all participants. PNF Feather River District Ranger Randy Gould made a quick presentation to those assembled for the class. Randy thanked all attending and provided best wishes for a successful class. The Chainsaw Training curriculum was followed and the BCHC Power Point was utilized to insure all points were presented. The PNF Chainsaw Trainer Mike Hyett, fellow PNF Fire Fighter and Hotshot crew member James Maynard presented sections of the curriculum, BCHC Chainsaw Trainers Chris Vallerga and Bob Gage also presented sections of the curriculum. During each section, each trainer provided antidotal input all topics covered as well. The students were also encouraged to interact with the trainers on topics. Safety was a main topic of discussion, Safety Situational Awareness, Safe Operation of the Saws, Safety, Safety, Safety - in ALL aspects of Chainsaw Operations. OHLEC was sressed to all students and PPE was also addressed as per the Training Manual.

The classroom portion of the program ended on Saturday with discussions on communications, 1st Aid/CPR procedures and a Tailgate Safety Session prior to a hands-on view of Chainsaws, Chains, tools, PPE, and sample of a Chainsaw Kit or required tools for the Chainsaw Individual or team.

Day Two:

On Sunday Morning at 07:30, the class met at the PNF Feather River District Office and then carpooled to the In-Field Evaluation Site off Lower Forbestown Road in the Plumas National Forest, an approximate 20-25-minute drive from the District Office. (Two members of the class met the rest of the class at the Fire station near the turn off on Lower Forbestown Road as it was closer to their home than the District Office.) There were two additional PNF Saw Trainers who also participated in the In-Field portion of the class. The ratio of evaluators was 1 to 2 during the evaluation of each student.

A Tailgate Safety Session hosted by PNF Trainer Mike Hyett, all individuals participating were involved in the Tailgate Safety Session process.

After the Tailgate Safety Session, we hiked a short distance to the Evaluation area, where there was a demonstration of proper Chainsaw operation was presented by PNF personnel. After the demonstrations, the group broke up into groups of 2 for the evaluation of each individual and their operation of the chainsaw in different situations with different binds and cut scenarios.

Each student was evaluated as to their knowledge, ability and verbal assessment of the situation, following the Evaluation Form provided in the Chainsaw Training Program.

All eleven Chainsaw Trainees related that they learned a lot in the class and felt the class was well presented and the curriculum complete. The students were asked to complete a Class Evaluation and the results were all positive from the students.






The evening dinners and wine tasting were a great time to socialize and meet other members of BCH. There were a lot of nice items to bid on in the silent auction and live auction.






To make this year extra special our own Education Chairperson Thomas Firth received the Backcountry Horsemen of California Education Award. "Great Job Tom!"

Load Up ParkWatch Report



As you saddle up and before you head down the trail you always do a safety check. You are wearing a helmet, carrying water, the cinch is tight, and

your cell phone is in your pocket. On your cell phone, you have previously downloaded the free phone app provided by Park-WatchReport and you have the app OPEN before you mount up and leave the staging area. Right? No? Here is why you should......

In 2008 two equestrians in northern California were badly injured, one horse was killed and another horse went missing in what was thought to be a case of trail conflict (horse vs motorcycle). Further investigation revealed that the source of the problem was a maintenance issue that no one had reported (a hole in a fence which gave the motorcycle riders access to a horse/hiker only trail). One of the injured riders was a member of Action Coalition for Equestrians (ACE), a northern California advocacy group that has focused all their resources on improving trail access and safety for equestrians for the nearly 15 years.

The ACE Board of Directors acted. They hired a website designer to create a website called ParkWatchReport to give trail users a place to report trail issues, concerns, observations, and comments with the assurance that ACE would deliver the information to the appropriate park manager. It worked wonderfully. In just a few years they collected over 650 reports!

In 2014 ParkWatchReport was incorporated, the website was upgraded, a free phone app was added and the service was made available nationwide.

In the parks where ParkWatchReport is used by concerned trail riders the incidents of neglected maintenance, trail conflict, vandalism, thief and illegal activities are dealt with promptly and recurrence of reduced.

Expect to hear more about ParkWatchReport in future newsletters but don't wait to download the app at Google Play or Apple Store and start using it. Just one report would have prevented all the grief brought on in 2008 by a fence that wasn't repaired. More information about ParkWatchReport is available at:






